


MFO 1: STABLE SUPPLY AND PRICE OF STAPLE CEREALS

PROCUREMENT

a. Palay

For the month of February 2017, NFA procured 1,727 MT of palay, which is 19.51% accomplishment of the month's target of 8,855 MT. The decrease in procurement can be attributed to the end of the main harvest season, where there were no more/very minimal available palay stocks to procure, as prevailing farmgate prices are higher than the government selling price.



DISTRIBUTION

For the month, NFA distributed 71,958 MT of rice, equivalent to 87.14% accomplishment of the target of 82,575 MT for February.

IMPORTATION

The Food Security Council on Rice (FSC-Rice) convened on January 24, 2017 to discuss and assess the current as well as the projected supply and demand of rice (for the 1st semester of 2017) to determine the urgency of immediately importing the additional 250TMT as requested by the NFA to beef up the buffer stock.

All committee members were in agreement that rice importation by NFA is not that urgent, especially with the impending arrival of MAV.

PRICES

Based on the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) summary of commercial palay/rice prices, the average ex-farm price posted an increase of \$\mathbb{P}0.33\$ from last month's price of \$\mathbb{P}17.96\$ to \$\mathbb{P}18.29\$ for this month, as it was the end of the main harvest season. NFA buying price for palay is comparatively lower by \$\mathbb{P}1.29/kg\$. For corn, NFA's buying price were higher by \$\mathbb{P}0.85/kg\$. and \$\mathbb{P}0.56/kg\$. compared to the prevailing commercial level, respectively.

Wholesale and retail prices of rice generally posted increases of P0.23/kg and P0.11/kg for WMR, and at P0.22/kg. and P0.01/kg. for RMR, respectively. Corn prices likewise manifested increases, both in wholesale and retail level.

MFO 3: BUFFER STOCK OF STAPLE CEREALS EFFECTIVELY MANAGED

RICE STOCK INVENTORY

As of February 28, 2017, NFA had a stock inventory of 7,939,379 bags (total rice equivalent –TRE) or 396,968.95 MT, good to last for 12 days, based on the 2017 national daily rice consumption requirement of 32,720 MT.

NATIONAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT (QSAR) OF NFA STOCKS FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY 2017

The total volume of NFA stored grains assessed for the month of February is 8,426,380.6 bags, composed of palay, milled rice and corngrits, a decrease of 15.25% from the January volume of 9,943,045 bags. Stocks fit as food (rice) represent 99.97% of the total assessed grains. Stocks for disposition were 2,749.1 bags (0.032%), composed of sweepings and partially damaged stocks, and 195 bags (0.002%) of totally damaged milled rice.

MFO 4: DEVELOPMENTAL REGULATION OF THE GRAINS INDUSTRY IMPLEMENTED AND ENFORCED

REGISTERED/LICENSED GRAINS BUSINESSMEN

For the month of February, NFA registered and licensed 11,297 applicants, 342 of whom availed of the two-year (2018-2019) advance-license scheme. Total R/L collections on grains business activities amounted to P27,344,397.19, which include collection from mobile licensing amounting to P3,684,258.77, and P356,941.72 from advance license collections. 1,226 metal plates were issued/sold for P245,200 The R/L fees comprised 34.67% of the annual targeted collection of P161M.

Testing

For the month, FDC performed 7 physical and sensory evaluation, 158 chemical analysis, 11 contaminants, 59 microbiological, and 1 micro analytical quality evaluation, to determine safety and quality of white rice, brown rice, corn grits, other cereals, and various food and food products. Other activities included the testing of packaging materials and label evaluation; heat penetration and heat distribution test to establish and/or evaluate adequacy of thermal processes of canned goods; shelf life testing to establish shelf life of various packaged products; and the conduct of seminar/training.
