
National Food Authority Accomplishment Report July 2018



MFO 1: STABLE SUPPLY AND PRICE OF STAPLE CEREALS


PROCUREMENT

For the month of July 2018, NFA procured 30 MT of palay, which is 1.64% accomplishment of the month's target of 1,830 MT. The continued low procurement is still due to the prevailing high farm-gate prices of palay, at P21.63/kg., (as of July 31, 2018), P4.63/kg. higher than the government's buying price of P17.00/kg.



DISTRIBUTION

For the month of July, NFA distributed 57,351 MT of rice, equivalent to 70.79% accomplishment of the month's target of 81,011 MT. Import arrivals enabled NFA to increase its distribution in the market.

FARMERS WHO SOLD PALAY TO NFA FOR THE MONTH OF JULY

For July 2018, 59 farmers sold their palay to NFA, a 25% decrease compared to last year's record of 79 farmers. Total palay deliveries of 634.70 bags, amounting to P538,897.19 is 89% lower than last year's same period deliveries of 6,024.11 bags, amounting to P1.8M.

PRICES

Based on the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) summary of commercial palay/rice prices, the average ex-farm price nationwide, increased further from P21.31/kg to P21.63/kg or by 1.50% from last month. NFA's buying prices for yellow and white corn were likewise, lower by P2.06/kg. and P2.61/kg than the prevailing commercial prices, respectively.

Prices of WMR and RMR posted increases of P0.71/kg. and P0.76/kg. in the wholesale level, and P0.67/kg. and P0.70/kg. in the retail level, respectively. For yellow corn, wholesale price showed a slight decrease of P0.02/kg, but manifested an increase of P0.31/kg. in retail. For white corn, prices posted decrease of P0.67/kg and P1.53/kg both in wholesale and retail level.

MFO 3: BUFFER STOCK OF STAPLE CEREALS

RICE STOCK INVENTORY

As of July 31, 2018, NFA stock inventory of 2,023,064 bags (total rice equivalent –TRE) or 101,153 MT, is good to last for 3.16 days, based on the 2018 national daily rice consumption requirement of 32,013 MT.

NATIONAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT (QSAR) OF NFA STOCKS

The total volume of assessed NFA stored grains as of the end of July 2018 was 1,956,189.9 bags, an increase of 83.43% from last month's volume of 1,066,429.5 bags. Stocks fit as food (rice) and feed (corn) represent 99.998% of the total assessed grains. Stocks for disposition totaled 46 bags, composed of partially damaged and totally damaged milled rice.

MFO 4: DEVELOPMENTAL REGULATION OF THE GRAINS INDUSTRY IMPLEMENTED AND ENFORCED

REGISTERED/LICENSED GRAINS BUSINESSMEN

For the month of July, NFA registered and licensed 3,758 applicants, Total R/L collections on grains business activities amounted to P6,439,282.81 including mobile licensing amounting to P496,035.15. The 237 metal plates that were issued, amounted to P47,400.00. The cumulative R/L fees collected amounting to P168,501,919.79 represents 112.33% of the annual target collection of P150M. Note that majority of those who applied for licenses are engaged in the selling of commercial rice.

For the month of July, FDC performed 2 physical and sensory evaluation, chemical analysis, four microanalytical (Filth), and 37 microbiological quality evaluation, to determine safety and quality of white rice, brown rice, corn grits, other cereals, and various food and food products. Other activities included the testing of packaging materials and label evaluation; heat penetration and heat distribution test to establish and/or evaluate adequacy of thermal processes of canned goods; shelf life testing to establish shelf life of various packaged products; and the conduct of seminar/training.
