


I. SUPPLY AND PRICE OF STAPLE CEREALS

PROCUREMENT


Palay

For the 4th quarter of 2019, NFA procured 364,366 MT of palay, which is 96.81% accomplishment of the quarter's target of 376,387. and 93.67% of the original Council approved volume of 389,000MT for the year. This is 55.05% higher than the 41.76% accomplishment for the same quarter last year.



DISTRIBUTION

For the 4th quarter of 2019, NFA distributed 107,715 MT of rice, equivalent to 29.92% accomplishment of the quarter's target of 353.350 MT. This is 30.13% lower than the 60.05 % accomplishment for the same quarter last year. The low distribution can be attributed to the abundant supply of low priced, good quality rice in the market.

The average ex-farm prices of palay for the quarter at ₱15.56/kg posted a ₱3.44/kg difference from the NFA's buying price of ₱19.00/kg. Likewise, ex-farm prices for yellow corn at ₱12.51/kg and white corn at ₱13.56/kg were higher by ₱0.21/kg and ₱0.56/kg respectively, compared to the NFA buying price of corn.

For the 4th quarter of 2019, WMR and RMR wholesale prices posted an average price of \$\frac{1}{2}37.46\$/kg and \$\frac{1}{2}41.63\$/kg, respectively. Compared with same period last year, WMR decreased by \$\frac{1}{2}5.79\$/kg., while RMR increased by \$\frac{1}{2}1.39\$/kg. On the retail level, WMR and RMR average prices were at \$\frac{1}{2}3.34\$/kg and \$\frac{1}{2}36.84\$/kg, posting an average decreased of \$\frac{1}{2}13.55\$/kg and \$\frac{1}{2}6.61\$/kg, compared to 2018, respectively. Wholesale and retail prices of yellow corn registered an increased of \$\frac{1}{2}0.54\$/kg and \$\frac{1}{2}0.05\$/kg., compared last year. For white corn wholesale and retail price posted a decrease of \$\frac{1}{2}3.89\$/kg. and \$\frac{1}{2}1.07\$/kg., respectively.

II. BUFFER STOCK OF STAPLE CEREALS EFFECTIVELY MANAGED

RICE STOCK INVENTORY

For the 4th quarter of 2020, NFA stock inventory of 10,279,424 bags (total rice equivalent –TRE) or 513,971 MT, is good to last for 15.77 days, based on the 2019 national daily rice consumption requirement of 32,593 MT

NATIONAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT (QSAR) OF NFA STOCKS

The total average volume of assessed NFA stored grains for the 4th quarter of 2019 was 13,811,943.03 bags, composed of palay, milled rice and corn grains, Stocks fit as food (rice) and feed (corn) represent 99.907% of the total assessed grains. Stocks for disposition were 14,619.30 bags which comprise the (0.093%) totally damaged milled rice.
