
January 2020 Accomplishment Report



I. SUPPLY AND PRICE OF STAPLE CEREALS


PROCUREMENT

For the month of January 2020, NFA procured 46,979 MT of palay, which is 115.78% accomplishment of the month's target of 40,575 MT. The high accomplishment is due to NFA's buying price being higher than the prevailing ex-farm prices.



DISTRIBUTION

For the month of January 2020 NFA distributed 45,572 MT of rice, equivalent to 154.04% accomplishment of the month's target of 29,585 MT.



PRICES

Based on the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) summary ex-farm prices of palay/rice, the average ex-farm price posted an increase of P0.13 from last month's price of P15.51 to P15.64 for this month.

Wholesale and retail prices of WMR posted a slight decrease of P0.03/kg and P0.08/kg., and an increase of P0.85/kg and P0.11/kg. respectively. Prices of white corn decreased by P0.25/kg. in the wholesale level, and increased by P0.01/kg. in the retail level. On the other, the wholesale price of yellow corn increased by P0.72/kg, but the retail price decreased by P0.56/kg.

II. BUFFER STOCK OF STAPLE CEREALS EFFECTIVELY MANAGED

RICE STOCK INVENTORY

As of January 31, 2020, the NFA stock inventory of 9,773,740 bags (total rice equivalent –TRE) or 488,687 MT, is good to last for 14.77 days, based on the 2020 national daily rice consumption requirement of 33,097 MT.

TECHNICAL RESEARCH AND SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Engineering Services

The construction and maintenance of storage facilities and office buildings were aimed to improve NFA's operations:

- Construction of a 45-TCC Warehouse in Bantay, Ilocos Sur.at 57.20% accomplishment.
- Construction of Central Office Building in Visayas Avenue, Quezon City.
- Construction of 100 TCC warehouse 1 in Alang-alang Leyte at 93% accomplishment.

Metrology Services

During the month, Metrology Division undertook troubleshooting, repair, verification, and adjustment of metrology equipment of Field Offices as requested, thereby allowing NFA to save an estimated amount of Php 96,000.00 for directly undertaking such services.

Truck scale Utilization

The technical assistance provided by the Metrology Division in keeping the field offices truck scales in good operating condition, indirectly helped NFA save from handling cost, and generated an income amounting to Php 7,265,783.40; this amount generated in January 2020 only.

NATIONAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT (QSAR) OF NFA STOCKS

The total volume of assessed NFA stored grains as of January 31, 2019 was 14,137438.8 bags, composed of palay, milled rice and corn grains, a decrease of 9.59% from December volume of 15,636,179.5 bags. Stocks fit as food (rice) and feed (corn) represent 99.995% of the total assessed grains. Stocks for disposition were 753.3 bags, composed of (0.005%) totally damaged milled rice.
