
ENSURE FOOD SECURITY THROUGH MAINTENANCE OF BUFFER STOCKS

PALAY PROCUREMENT

For the 1st quarter of 2021, NFA procured 24,797.3 MT of palay, which is 20.75% accomplishment of the quarter's target of 141,245 MT. This is 86.56% lower than the 124,602 MT accomplishment for the same quarter last year.


DISTRIBUTION

For the 1st quarter of 2021, NFA distributed 152,246 MT of rice, equivalent to 283% accomplishment of the quarter's target of 53,793 MT. This is 43.30% higher than the 106,241 MT accomplishment for the same quarter last year. The high distribution can be attributed to the massive rice releases to DSWD, LGUs and other relief institutions, intended for COVID-19 relief operations.

I. BUFFER STOCK OF STAPLE CEREALS EFFECTIVELY MANAGED

NFA INVENTORY

As of March 31, 2021, NFA's stock inventory of 4,823,418 bags (total rice equivalent –TRE) or 241,170.9 MT is good to last for 7.19 days, based on the daily rice consumption rate. However, based on Average Daily Sales of NFA at 30,982 bags, the inventory is good to last for 155.68 days. It should be noted that NFA's inventory is only part of the national rice inventory of the entire country.

NATIONAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT (QSAR) OF NFA STOCKS

The total average volume of assessed NFA stored grains for the 1st quarter of 2021 was 8,038,740.20 bags, composed of palay and milled rice. Stocks fit as food (rice) represents 99.990% of the total assessed grains. Totally damaged milled rice stocks for disposition consisted of 720.83 bags, equivalent to 0.48% of the total stock inventory.
