


MFO 1: STABLE SUPPLY AND PRICE OF STAPLE CEREALS

PROCUREMENT

a. Palay

For the month of November 2016, NFA procured 28,632 MT of palay, which is 71.65% accomplishment of the month's target of 39,963 MT. The increase in procurement is due to the on-going harvest season and intensified palay-buying implemented by the agency, nationwide.



DISTRIBUTION

For the month, NFA distributed 16,484 MT of rice, equivalent to 18% accomplishment of the target of 89,495 MT for November.

IMPORTATION

Of the 250,000 MT imported for the lean months, 235,441.5 MT or 94.18% have been delivered to NFA warehouses.

PRICES

Based on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) summary of commercial palay/rice prices, the average ex-farm price declined further to \$\partial 17.28/kg\$ from \$\partial 17.55/kg\$ in October due to on-going harvest season.

Rice prices continue to post a decrease from last month's prices. Wholesale and retail prices of WMR decreased by P0.23/kg and P0.17/kg, respectively. Likewise for RMR, there was a P0.26/kg decrease in wholesale, and P0.16/kg in retail prices. The decrease in rice prices can be attributed to continued downward trend of ex-farm price of palay nationwide.

MFO 3: BUFFER STOCK OF STAPLE CEREALS EFFECTIVELY MANAGED

RICE STOCK INVENTORY

As of November 30, 2016, NFA had a stock inventory of 12,048,546 bags (total rice equivalent –TRE) or 602,427.3MT, good to last for 19 days, based on the 2016 national daily rice consumption requirement of 32,150 MT.

NATIONAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT (QSAR) OF NFA STOCKS FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 2016

The total volume of NFA stored grains assessed for the month of November is 12,834,841 bags, composed of palay, milled rice and corngrits, an increase of 9.46% from the October volume of 11,725,538 bags. Stocks fit as food (rice) represents 99.98% of the total assessed grains. Stocks for disposition were 2,428 bags (0.019%) composed of sweepings, partially damaged stocks and 255 bags (0.002%) of totally damaged milled rice.

MFO 4: DEVELOPMENTAL REGULATION OF THE GRAINS INDUSTRY IMPLEMENTED AND ENFORCED

REGISTERED/LICENSED GRAINS BUSINESSMEN

For the month of November, NFA registered and licensed 583 applicants, of which 69 grains businessmen availed of the two-year (2017-2018) advance-license scheme. Total R/L collections on grains business activities amounted to P867,958.82, which include collection from mobile licensing amounting to P667,095, and P17,710 from advanced collections. 273 metal plates were issued/sold for P54,600 The cumulative R/L fees comprised 97.62% of the annual targeted collection of P154M.

FOOD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

<u>Testing</u>

For the month, FDC performed 46 chemical analysis, 48 contaminants laboratory, 5 micro analytical, 5 package testing and 37 microbiological quality evaluation, to determine safety and quality of white rice, brown rice, corn grits, other cereals, and various food and food products. Other activities included the testing of packaging materials and label evaluation; heat penetration and heat distribution test to establish and/or evaluate adequacy of thermal processes of canned goods; shelf life testing to establish shelf life of various packaged products.
