ADVISORY ON THE USAGE OF THE TERM "BASMATI" RICE

Pursuant to the Department of Agriculture Memorandum dated 24 October 2012 regarding the Embassy of India's Note Verbale No. Mani/Com/215/1/2012 dated 16 July 2012, expressing its concern on the usage of the term "BASMATI" rice for such kind of rice grown in the Philippines for exports to the Middle East countries and thereby requesting to issue appropriate instructions on this matter, this Letter-Circular is hereby issued.

As per information from the Embassy of India, the term "BASMATI" is:

- 1. A geographical indication **applied to aromatic rice grown and produced in a particular geographical region of the Indian Sub-Continent**, below the foothills of the Himalayas, forming part of the Indo-Gangetic Plains;
- 2. Protected internationally by the Government of India through Basmati Development Fund, a fund overseen by Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) of India; and
- **3. Vested only** to be used by the growers, producers, farmers and traders of Basmati rice grown **in the geographical Indian area**.

In view hereof, all rice millers, exporters, traders, wholesalers, retailers, repackers, manufacturers, producers of rice and all concerned are instructed **to cease from using the term "BASMATI" rice** for locally grown/produced long-grain aromatic rice varieties.

The brand name of locally grown/produced aromatic rice varieties having similar characteristics as the "BASMATI RICE" grown in India should never be identified as "BASMATI RICE."
